

Douglas Paterson, FCSLA, ASLA. Doug is an Associate Professor and former director of the Landscape Architecture Program at UBC. He is also past-president of the Canadian Society of Landscape Architects, a Fellow and past chair of the CSLA College of Fellows, and a past regional director of the North America Council of Educators in Landscape Architecture. He has served on the editorial advisory boards of Landscape Architecture Magazine, the Journal of Landscape and Urban Planning, and Landscapes/Paysages. Locally, he has served as a member of the Vancouver Urban Design Panel, a member and chair of the Vancouver Planning Commission and the citizen-at-large representative on the Hasting's Park Restoration Committee in Vancouver. He is currently a member of the Vimy Memorial Restoration Advisory Committee, in Vimy, France.

Over the years Doug has directed long-term, parks and recreation master plans for cities such as Winnipeg, Regina and North Vancouver as well as for numerous smaller communities. He has also undertaken specific park master plans for several large scale parks across western Canada at the urban, regional and provincial scales. His research focuses on the public realm and in particular, the notions of civic imagination, and place-bound imagination. He also teaches a studio in park design at UBC.
