

A BYLAW OF THE CITY OF VICTORIA

to amend the Sign Bylaw to exempt signs located on public property that is used for an outdoor market.

Under its statutory powers, including sections 579 and 967 of the Municipal Act and section 12 of the Victoria City Act, 1922, the Municipal Council of the City of Victoria enacts the following provisions:

1. This Bylaw may be cited as the "SIGN BYLAW, AMENDMENT BYLAW (NO. 2)."
2. Bylaw No. 92-30, the Sign Bylaw, is amended in section 4.1 by adding the following definition:

"outdoor market" means a business that, for a fee, permits individuals to use or occupy a space, table or booth outdoors on public property for the purpose of retail marketing of goods or services and for which purpose an agreement with the City authorizes that use of the public property.

3. The Sign Bylaw is further amended in section 7.1 by adding the following paragraph:

"(1) a sign that

- (a) is located on public property while that property is being used for the operation of an outdoor market; and

(b) advertises the outdoor market
or its goods or services."
