<p><b>Capital Project Updates</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>- Construction underway on the multi-use path through Beacon Hill Park – part of AAA connections to Dallas Road and Vancouver Street.</li> <li>- New sidewalk installations on Pleasant St</li> <li>- New sidewalk project at Cook &amp; Higgins</li> <li>- New sidewalk and boulevard on Fort Street (between Fern &amp; Oak Bay)</li> <li>- Final pedestrian upgrades will be completed this fall as a part of North Park village traffic calming project underway at Pandora and Cook</li> <li>- Permanent traffic calming installation at Kings and Fifth</li> <li>- New crosswalk at Bouchier &amp; Amphion</li> <li>- New crosswalk at 700 Blk Caledonia</li> <li>- 5 new Modo car share vehicles on street</li> <li>- Fall 2018 school safety project with elementary schools – focusing on educating and reinforcing with families</li> <li>- David Foster Harbour Pathway – underpass project going out to tender in Q4</li> <li>- Confirmed partnership with the Pearl development – project to continue David Foster Harbour Pathway north of the Janion Building</li> <li>- Laurel Point Remediation Project – Major environmental remediation project with closures to Pathway until end of 2019</li> <li>- CRD is doing final consultation and preparing for construction for the pump station and sewage treatment force main – Dallas road cycle track and pedestrian improvements will be completed as a part of this project.</li> <li>- Crystal Pool – parking options study and follow-up recommendations on pathways and bicycle parking</li> <li>- Wharf &amp; Humboldt AAA Infrastructure – underground infrastructure renewal and bike lanes to start</li> </ul>	For Information

Public engagement starting November 2018.</li> <li>- Transit Shelter Replacement Project – 5 targeted over the next 4 months</li> <li>- Douglas Street Dedicated Bus Lanes – opening late October, early November. More information at upcoming ATAC meeting.</li> </ul>		
	<p><b>Sustainable Mobility Strategy – ATAC Initial Engagement</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>- As per direction from Council, the City is developing a sustainable mobility strategy in 2018/2019.</li> <li>- The goal is to establish a document that links existing master plans (eg: pavement master plan, transit plan, bike network plan) and confirm policies, investment approaches and priorities to support moving people, goods and services within Victoria</li> <li>- There will be considerable involvement and engagement with the public, service providers, agencies and partners – all topics from parking to transit infrastructure to smart cities to curb space management.</li> <li>- The City and its consulting team is working to produce a new mobility fact book to support sharing where the City is at now and some of the pressures and trends to consider in the future</li> <li>- The SMS project is a key project from the Climate Leadership Plan and is intended to support integrated land use and mobility planning.</li> </ul>
