



New Bridge Images Unveiled

VICTORIA, BC — At the request of the Johnson Street Bridge Citizens Advisory Committee, the design team working on behalf of the City of Victoria has produced enhanced new images of the Johnson Street Bridge.

An animated fly-through showing the new Rolling Bascule Bridge placed in the context of the Capital City gives Victorians a chance to envision how the design will be integrated into its surroundings. There are also new still renderings that include Victoria landmarks for context.

“Seeing these images really conveys a feeling of how breathtaking this new bridge will be in Victoria’s Inner Harbour,” said Citizen Advisor, David Cubberley. “These new illustrations generate a greater understanding of the improved amenities this new bridge will provide, including dedicated bike lanes and pedestrian walkways.”

The members of the advisory committee noted that the new bridge is a one-of-a-kind design, providing an iconic structure that will be unique to Victoria.

“I am delighted we now have improved images to share with the public,” notes Cara Segger a member of the Citizens Advisory Committee. “I think people will really enjoy being able to pass underneath the virtual bridge and explore the approaches this way.”

The fly-through was produced by world-renowned Wilkinson-Eyre Architects based in London, UK.
