



Victoria's Fireworks Bylaw Benefits Public Safety

VICTORIA, BC — With Halloween approaching, the public is reminded that a City of Victoria Fireworks Bylaw prohibits the sale, possession or discharge of fireworks. The bylaw has been effective in its three years, significantly reducing nuisance fireworks calls. Previously, irresponsible use of fireworks has resulted in property damage, injuries, pet stress, and an increase in nuisance calls to emergency service agencies.

The Fireworks Bylaw includes firecrackers, fireballs, Roman Candles, sky rockets, squibs, torpedoes, and any other explosive designated as a firework by regulation. Victoria Police enforce the bylaw and failure to comply results in seizures and fines. Penalties are applied per incident with a minimum penalty of \$200 and a maximum of \$10,000.

Exceptions to the bylaw are available through an application for a special fireworks permit, and applications must be accompanied by proof of \$5 million liability insurance and a Fireworks Supervisor Certificate. For a copy of the Fireworks Bylaw visit: www.victoria.ca/common/pdfs/bylaw07-070.pdf
