



## Proposed Improvements for Cecelia Ravine

VICTORIA, BC – Cecelia Ravine is four hectares in area consisting of three City parks - Cecelia Ravine Park, Viaduct Park, and Cecelia Cove Park. The area is home to Cecelia Creek and migratory bird habitat, as well as the City's award-winning Burnside Gorge Community Centre, and is considered to be a gateway to the City of Victoria for pedestrians and cyclists who use the Galloping Goose Regional Trail.

Based on valuable community input, the City of Victoria is developing a management plan to guide future improvements to Cecelia Ravine. The goal is to create a safe and enjoyable park that protects and enhances the creek and surrounding parklands.

You and your family are invited to drop by an open house to learn more and provide feedback on Thursday, November 25, 2010 from 3 p.m. to 7:30 p.m. in the foyer of the Burnside Gorge Community Centre at 471 Cecelia Ravine. Registration is not required. Complimentary refreshments will be served. Free childcare will be available.

Take the opportunity to provide input on proposed improvements such as safer trail access points; new community garden space; nature and wildlife interpretation; a strategy to manage invasive species; a bike road safety learning area; an off-road bike skills park; outdoor fitness stations; and a hard surface sports court.

Participants will also have an opportunity to complete a short survey. Your input will help inform the improvement plan for Cecelia Ravine which will be presented to City Council in the New Year for consideration.
