



Information Meeting: Proposed Changes to Management of Gorge Waterway

VICTORIA, BC — The City of Victoria is proposing changes to the management of the Gorge Waterway to enhance the use of the Selkirk Water for recreation and to prohibit residential use and the storage of vessels. The City and members of the community are concerned about the negative impacts that unregulated marine activities are having on the marine environment and Victoria residents.

The community and the media are invited to attend an information meeting on Friday morning at the Victoria West Community Centre to learn about the changes being considered.
