



Explore Victoria's 2020 Bicycle Network Projects

VICTORIA, BC — The City is hosting four open house events for residents to provide feedback on the latest design concepts for the cycling corridors that will be improved in 2020.

The next projects in the City's 32 kilometer cycling network include Kimta Road, Government Street North, Richardson Street, and the Kings-Haultain corridor. These routes provide important connections from residential neighbourhoods to employment centres, schools, parks, and recreation centres. Since October 11, 2019 more than 900 people have taken part in engagement activities through an online survey, neighbourhood meetings, on-street information stations, and corridor tours, providing valuable insights, areas of concern, ideas, and opportunities for road safety improvements.

During the open house events, residents can see full-length corridor design concepts and talk to City staff about each of the projects scheduled for 2020. All feedback received at open house events will be considered in the preparation of recommended design concepts which will be presented to Council in early 2020.
