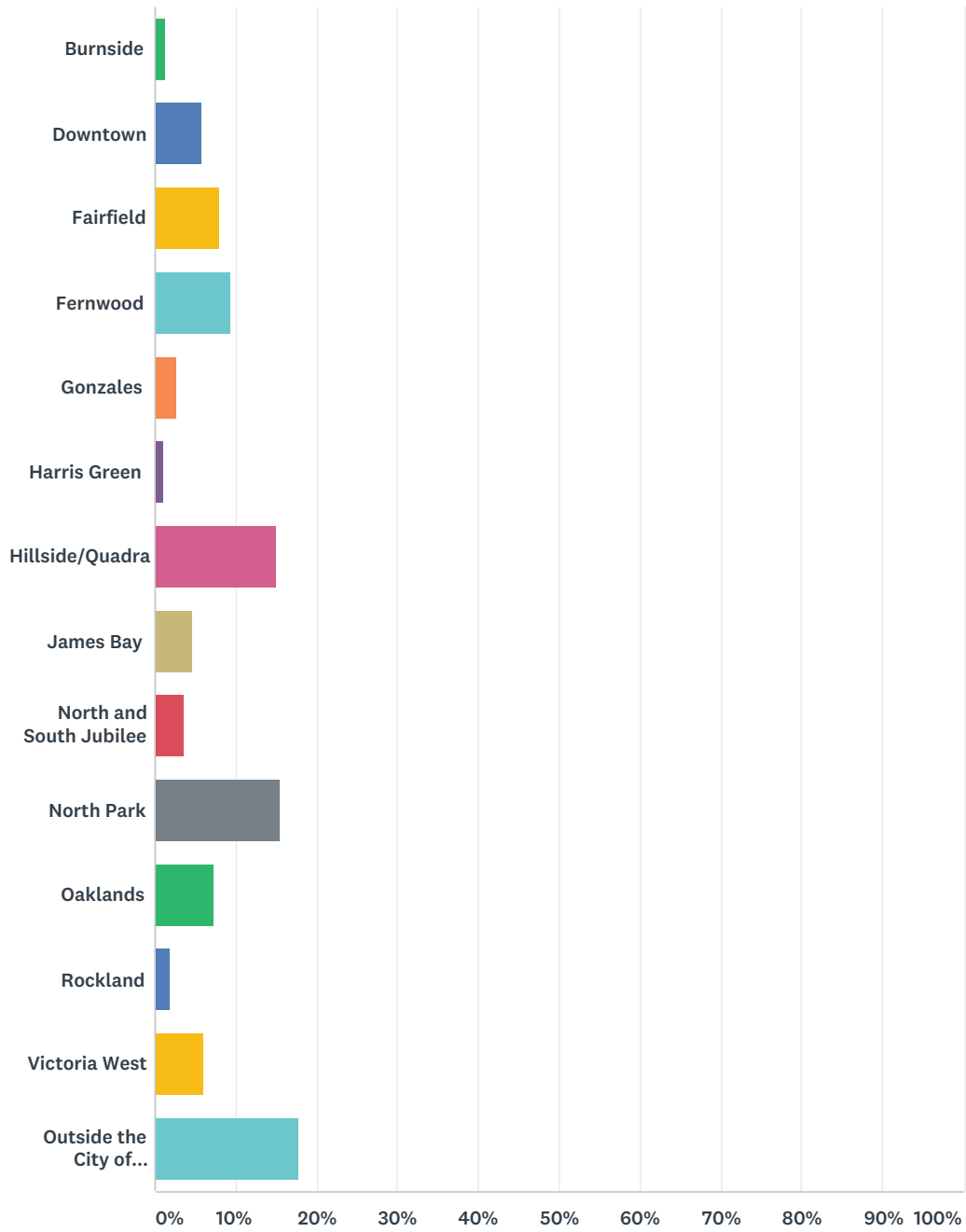


Q1 In which neighbourhood do you live?

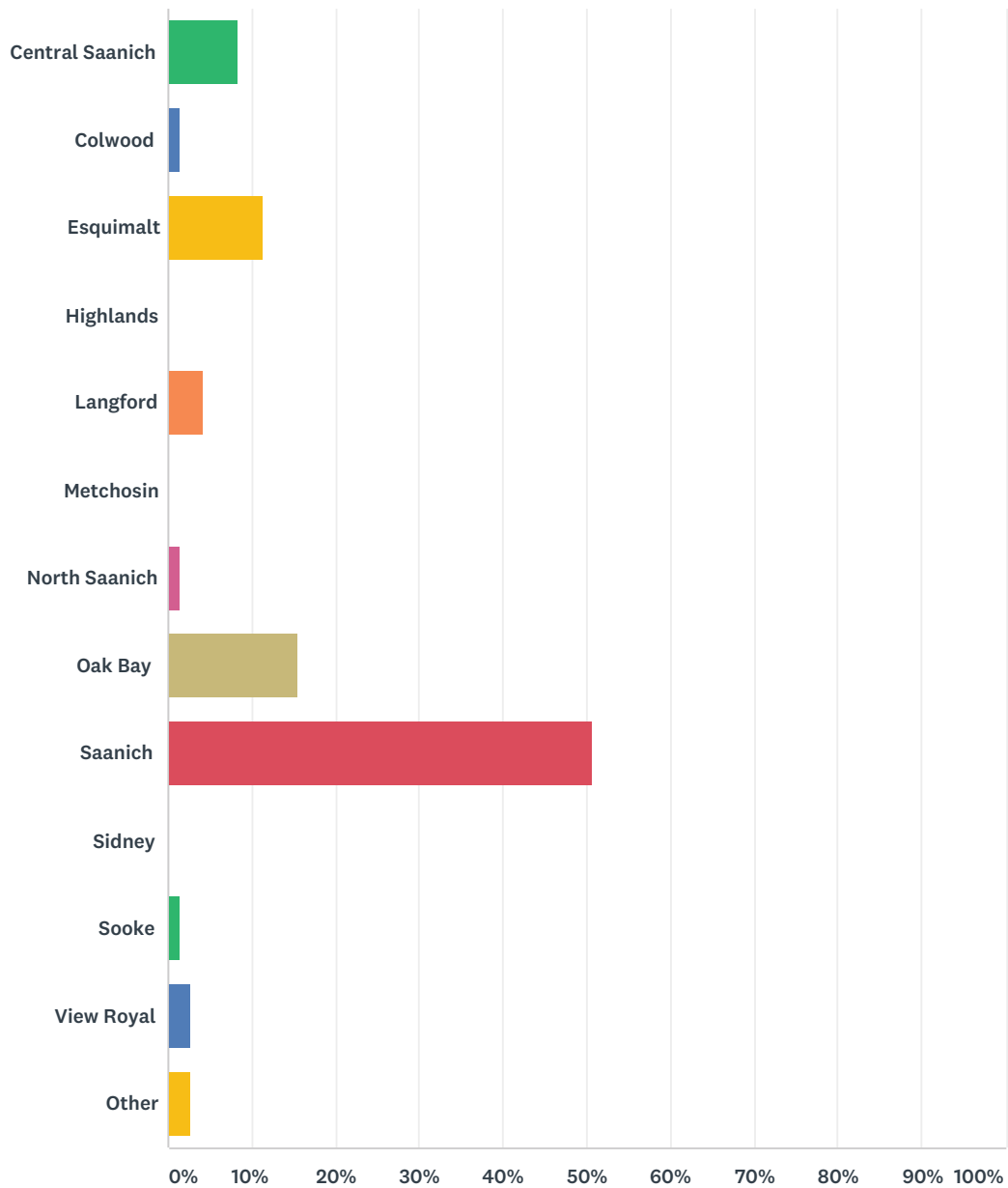

Furthermore, the parking lot steals green space and promotes private vehicle driving to this facility despite it being on a public transit corridor and future AAA bike network. the existing facility is the largest single GHG generator of the City at approx 20% of GHGs from municipal operations, so not committing to net zero energy/emissions and not connecting to the City-owned ice rink directly across the street is a major oversight and contradictory not only to this guiding principle, but to sustainable/fiscal prudence. similarly, promoting and prioritizing private vehicle use over community green space in a community already deemed deficient in park land by the OCP is an abhorration and major spatial justice issue for North Park.	7/2/2018 5:23 PM

Q12 How often do you visit Central Park?

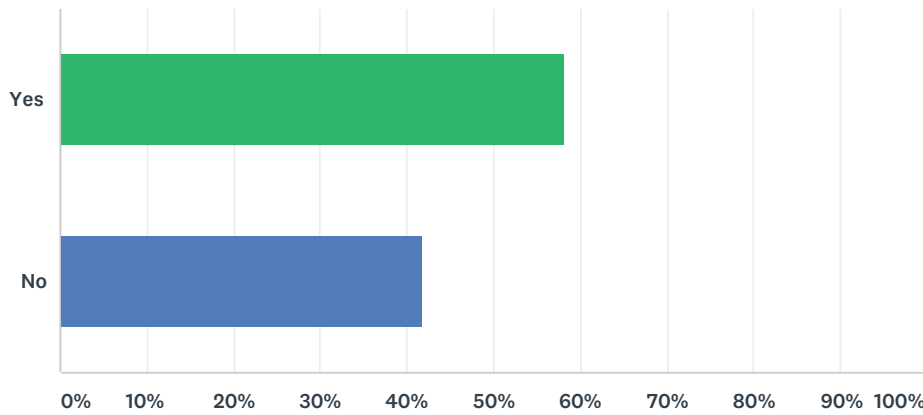

Q13 Have you participated in the public engagement process for this project?

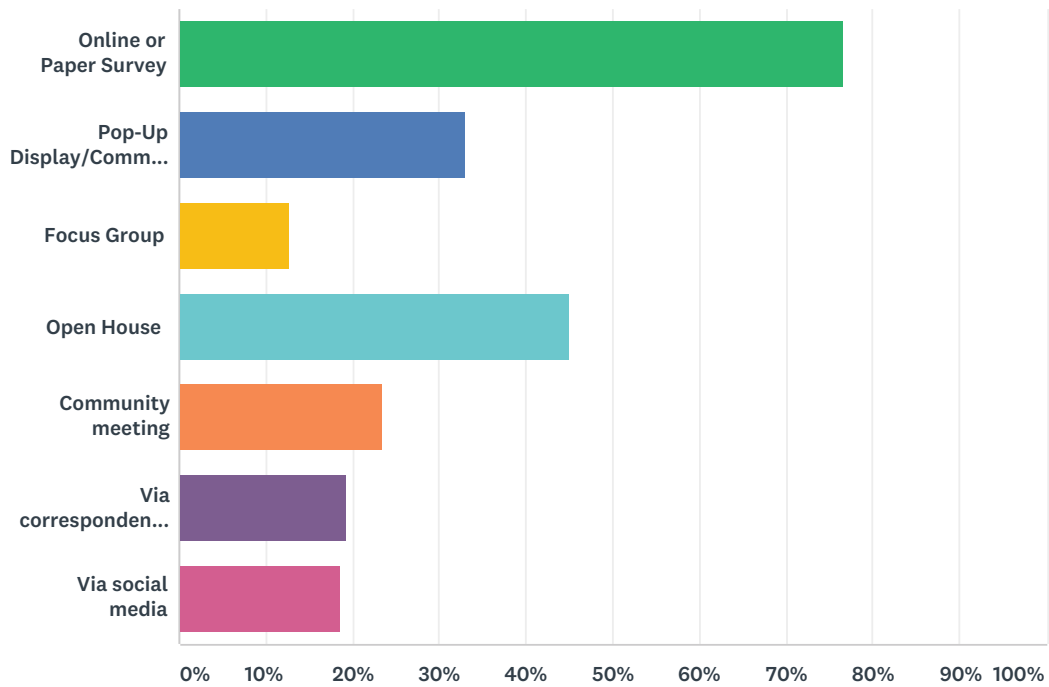

Q14 If you answered yes to the previous question, please indicate all the ways you participated.

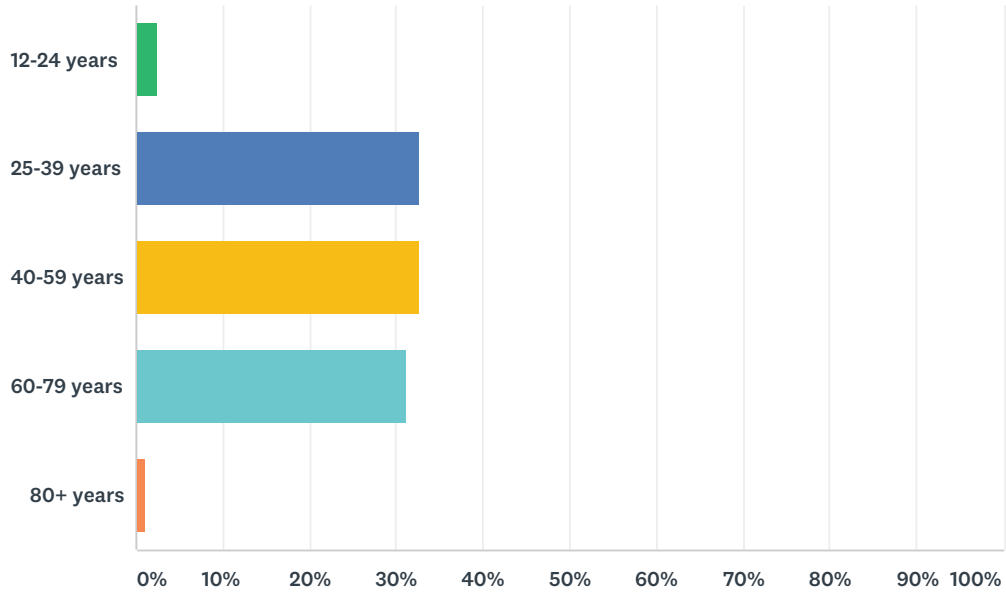

Q15 What is your age range?

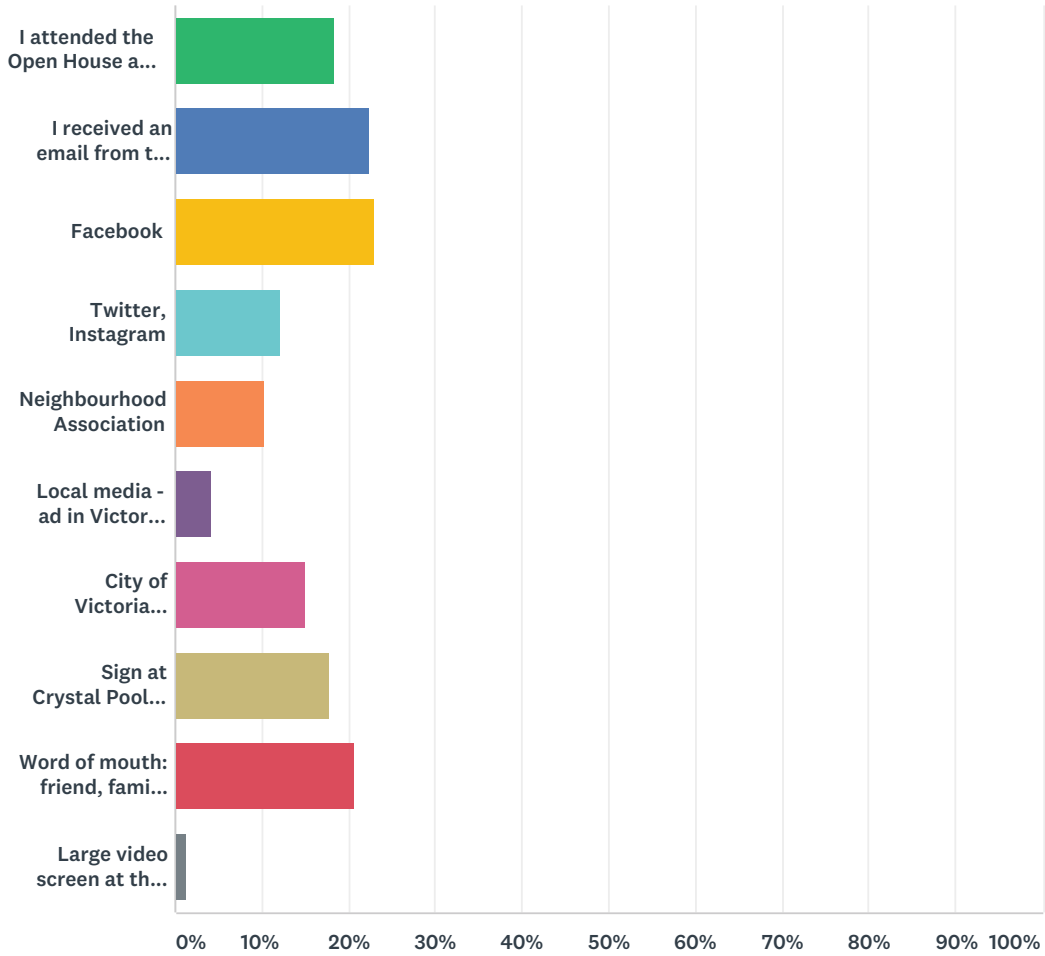
