### 1. Description of the Initiative

This PIA updates a previous PIA completed in 2011 when an outdoor camera was installed to capture still images of the new Johnson Street Bridge's construction.

When preliminary work on the new bridge began back in 2011, the outdoor camera captured still shots of the bridge project which are streamed to the Johnson Street Bridge website (<http://www.johnsonstreetbridge.com/streamed>). The images allow the public to view progress on the bridge's construction. The camera is bolted in place at the top of a nearby building that allows the camera to capture the construction site. The camera's field of vision cannot be moved and it cannot zoom or pan. The camera takes a still shot every second and the website is update once every 12 minutes. The camera will remain in place until all construction on the bridge is completed. The still images will then be used to create a time lapsed video for the public to view the bridge's construction from beginning to end.

This updated PIA is for the purpose of documenting that in addition to capturing still images the same camera will now also video a live feed of the bridge's construction.

### 2. Scope of this PIA

In addition to capturing still images, the camera will now also streamed a live video to Johnson Street Bridge's website and Youtube. Providing video will enhance the project information the public receives. No other changes regarding the use of the camera will occur. It remains in the same location and its field of vision does not change. It is still unable pan or zoom and the image quality remains unchanged. Unlike the still images, the video footage is not stored. Storage of the still images is on a hard drive accessed only from a locked room in a building adjacent to the construction area. Access to the room is limited to the contractor (Bullet Security).
