1. Welcoming

The Chair called the meeting to order at 5:35 p.m. He acknowledged that the City of Victoria is located on the homelands of the Songhees and Esquimalt First Nations communities.

The Committee discussed the following:

- Continued discussion on the various grant applications and rankings
- The desire to have unique programming and events supported by these grants
- Potential difficulties in tracking the impacts that certain organizations/events will have
- Support for projects offering multiple disciplines
- The desire to expand more on certain activities
- Preference for events and activities that would keep money and support within the community
- The need for safe spaces for the community
- The need for a sense of belonging in the community/for students
- The importance of physical space for the Black community
- Continued discussion and context on the criteria of the applications
- The need to focus on what the best outcome/impact could be from these grants
- The need to be prepared to justify reasoning in the application process
- The need to teach young people of colour the skills needed to navigate systemic racism, as well as confidence & self-empowerment
