- The fact that 'results' can be quantified in different ways
- Ideas for outreach, such as conducting surveys in the community
- The fact that the Committee has until the end of 2024 to conduct the three workshops
- Benefits of facilitating more introductions and interactions between City staff and the Black community
- Being able to combine ideas and resources through systems of thinking
- Proposed plans and ideas for workshops to be discussed next meeting
