1. Welcome and Land Acknowledgement

B. Hudlin assumed the role of Chair and acknowledged that the meeting is being held on the homelands of the Songhees and Esquimalt First Nations communities.

2. Approval of Minutes

a. Minutes from the meeting held March 21, 2023

3. Business Hub and Economic Development Overview – City of Victoria

The Business Ambassador provided a presentation to the Committee regarding the role and function of the City's Business Hub and how their resources can support entrepreneurs, and new and current businesses.

Committee discussed the following:

- Public events and job fairs hosted at City Hall to support entrepreneurs and businesses in Victoria and neighbouring communities
- The City does not provide grants to small businesses
- Futurpreneur currently provides programs for Black and Indigenous entrepreneurs
- Inquired if information on race, and business status, can be gathered when participants register for events

- Suggested developing an internal workshop for staff, and a workshop for Black entrepreneurs
- Interested in gaining an understanding of whether Black entrepreneurs struggle and how/if they received support when starting their businesses
- Suggested that upon submission and/or approval of a business licence, information regarding the Business Hub's resources be provided
- Important for the business community to know that the City welcomes them
- Important from an equity, diversity and inclusion perspective, that the City adhere to the Equity Framework and support a welcoming environment to business owners of colour
- The Business Hub will partner with the Committee to continue improving outreach to businesses
- Interested in capturing data of people of African descent reaching out for support
- Staff suggested hosting an event with the Futurpreneur's Black program
- Noted that there is no Black community business association
- Chambers of Commerce is a consideration for small businesses and has a \$400 yearly fee

4. <u>Discussion: Workshop planning</u>

Committee member, K. Panza, provided a briefing to the Committee regarding a workshop plan to engage City staff on themes from the International Decade of People of African Descent.

Committee discussed the following:

- Use a workshop setting to raise corporate awareness of the IDPAD initiative, support internal capacity development, and promote collaboration with City departments
- The best way for the Committee to get noticed is to continue their work plan and efforts
- Importance of collecting race-based data to identify gaps in services
- Interested in having a representative from all City departments
- Interactive format to collaborate with departments and discuss what is currently being done, and offer advice on how to target people of African Descent in Victoria
- Advantages of a virtual versus in-person format, and the timeline and planning practicalities
- Target audience could be the City's Community of Practice group that meets monthly
- Focus on articulating what the Committee has accomplished, and their specific goal moving forward
- Benefit of a system-thinking approach to establish a process for success, rather than a one-time win
- Staff will follow-up with the Committee on a workshop timeline and format options
- The Committee will develop the workshop content
