## D. **Evaluating the IDPAD Initiative:**

(CREAN)

Committee received a presentation from Sarah Ravensbergen from Coastal Research, Education, and Advocacy Network (CREAN) regarding the IDPAD initiative report.

Committee discussed the following:

- Using Grant Money to address insecurities (housing, health, ect...)
- Looking at the scope of eligible applicants and the possibility of expanding potential recipients of the grant
- The description and impacts column of the draft report
- The interviews CREAN has had with IDPAD youth grant recipients, members, and members of the public
- Feedback that IDPAD grant recipient interviewees gave during the surveys
- Discussion of extension of deadline for the Council report to later in July
- Adding time on the next IDPAD agenda to discuss the recommendations to Council
- Hosting a Town Hall in September
- How IDPAD can increase the funding source from the City, potentially by outsourcing
