PART 2.153 – RK-VW2 ZONE, VIC WEST ATTACHED DWELLING (DOUBLE ROW – GENERAL AREA) DISTRICT

2.153.1 Definitions

In this Part:

- a. "ground-oriented multiple dwelling" means a <u>building</u> used or designed as three or more <u>self-</u>contained dwelling units, each having direct access to the outside at grade level
- b. "residential lock-off unit" means a <u>self-contained dwelling unit</u> within a <u>ground-oriented</u> <u>multiple dwelling</u> with a lesser <u>floor area</u> than that of the principal <u>dwelling unit</u> from which it may be locked off, which must have both independent external access and shared internal access

2.153.2 Permitted Uses in this Zone

The following uses are the only uses permitted in this Zone:

- a. all uses permitted in the R1-B Zone, Single Family Dwelling District, subject to the regulations set out in Part 1.2 of the Zoning Regulation Bylaw
- b. all uses permitted in the R-2 Zone, Two Family Dwelling District, subject to the regulations set out in Part 2.1 of the Zoning Regulation Bylaw
- c. attached dwellings
- d. ground-oriented multiple dwellings
- e. residential lock-off unit

2.153.3 Additional Provisions for Attached Dwellings and Ground-Oriented Multiple Dwellings

- a. For attached dwellings and ground-oriented multiple dwellings:
 - i. in this Part, "<u>Street Boundary</u>", "<u>Street Frontage</u>" or "<u>Street Line</u>" means the boundary between a <u>lot</u> and a <u>street</u> provided that where a <u>lot</u> is bounded either in whole or in part by more than one <u>street</u>, the <u>street boundary</u> shall be deemed to be the widest boundary of the <u>lot</u> abutting a <u>street</u>, or when two or more <u>boundaries</u> are equal, the <u>boundary</u> the <u>lot</u> has in common with the widest of the abutting streets
 - ii. any <u>building</u> on the <u>lot</u> used as an <u>attached dwelling</u> or <u>ground-oriented multiple</u> <u>dwelling</u> shall be constructed so that the longest face of the <u>building</u> runs parallel to the street boundary

a. Lot area (minimum)

b. <u>Lot</u> width (minimum)

30m
