Application: Revitalization Tax Exemption Program for Affordable Rental Housing

The Affordable Rental Housing Revitalization Tax Exemption (RTE) program to provides 10-year tax exemptions to support the creation of affordable rental housing. Under the program, a property tax exemption is granted for the increased value resulting from the construction of the rental building.

A copy of all associated legal agreements (i.e. Housing Agreement, Lease Agreement, etc.) if applicable.
If required, a letter of authorization from the registered property owner.

4. FAQs

What are the RTE Program requirements?

- Non-Market Rental Stream
 - o The project is owned and operated by a non-profit housing provider
 - Applicants enter into a legal agreement securing rental tenure and affordability (flexible based on project) for 60 years
 - o Offer the Right of First Refusal to tenants displaced by the redevelopment to the affordable unit
- Market Rental Stream
 - 10 per cent of the units must be secured at 95% of Canada Mortgage and Housing Corporation (CMHC) median market rent for the City of Victoria for 60 years
 - o Rental tenure of building secured in perpetuity
 - o Offer the Right of First Refusal to tenants displaced by the redevelopment to the affordable units (income tested)

When should I apply for the Affordable Rental Housing RTE?

Interested parties are encouraged to apply to the RTE program when submitting their rezoning or development permit applications in order to streamline the legal agreement process. However, applicants can still apply any time before receiving their occupancy permit.

Are there other benefits to the Affordable Rental Housing RTE program?

- Provincial and regional portions of the mill rate are also exempt under the RTE program. This is done when the property is assessed by BC Assessment.
- City staff have coordinated with the CMHC to confirm that RTE participants are eligible to apply for 'Option 2' of the Apartment Construction Loan Program.

What happens after your RTE Agreement is signed?

Once the project has received its Occupancy Permit, a Tax Exemption Certificate (Schedule C of the RTE Bylaw) should be submitted to propertytax@victoria.ca.
