

I began painting after leaving a career in ecological conservation, which, along with a degree in wildlife biology, has focused my artwork on our connections with the natural world.
















Kerri Flannigan

Flannigan's illustrations and mural work focus on site specificity, and start with research (individual, and collective) to respond to the themes and histories associated with the location of the mural. Flannigan's illustrations often incorporate limited colour palettes and draw on a wide range of styles and influences, such as poster art, comics and graphic novels and children's books. Flannigan has shown locally and internationally, receiving funding from the Canada Council for the Arts Grant in 2023, and the B.C. Arts Council in 2022, and was an inaugural OUTstages residence in 2020/2021. Flannigan is currently developing two projection-based performances, Slow Dive and Wild Flame.









Chloe Purcell

Taka Sudo






